COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to enhance a Chaplain's skills in ministering effectively in a multi-cultural context.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this program, the participant should be able to:

- 1. Define the difference between Spirituality and Religion.
- 2. Discuss the purpose of Spiritual Assessments and how to use a Spiritual Assessment tool to assess and provide Spiritual care for a patient.
- 3. Identify several different Spiritual Assessment tools and how they function.
- 4. Identify Spiritual needs and address these spiritual needs appropriately.
- 5. Observe and recognize Cross-cultural variations in the Experience, Expressions, and understanding of grief, therefore better serving the patient in their times of need
- 6. Gain knowledge about the Diversity of persons in the hospital setting and how that influences the chaplain's ministry.
- 7. Discuss how much self-awareness plays an important part in ministering effectively to others.
- 8. Review how important it is to let the patient lead the path and help the patient find their own resources.
